

Daily Masses

On Tuesdays and Fridays, when there is a Grade School Mass at 8:00 am, masses will be celebrated at 6:15 and 8:00am. On these days there will be no 7:30 am mass. When there is not a grade school mass, masses will be celebrated at 6:15 and 7:30 am. Those who regularly attend the 7:30 am mass are encouraged and welcome to participate either in the 6:15 or 8:00 am masses when there is not a 7:30 am mass. All are encouraged to attend daily Masses, especially during Lent.

Lenten Outreach Project

As a parish family, it is customary that we collect Lenten Alms for those less fortunate. This year, we will be collecting our alms for St. Mary's Mission School in Red Lake, MN. In prior years, our alms have provided computers, aided in the establishment of seventh and eighth grade classrooms, provided scholarships for needy students and paid for the equipment needed for a new Science Lab. St. Mary's has had numerous challenges. As you recall, a fire destroyed their mission church 2017. Since then, families have been gathering for Mass in the school gym. Covid-19 meant that the students did not attend school in person for over a year and relied on remote learning. Currently, the church is being rebuilt and will open its doors by fall, 2022. During Lent, as we seek to draw closer to God, let us remember God's favor to us and ways in which we might share our favor with our lesser brothers and sisters in Christ.

Lenten Regulations

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
- 5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.



Next Sunday, our Catechumen, Brian Page, will be "sent" from Immaculate Conception to the Cathedral of St. Raymond in Joliet for the Rite of Election that afternoon, celebrated by Bishop Ron Hicks. He has affirmed his intention to be baptized and receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. The following Sunday, March 13, our candidate will participate in the Penitential Rite. Candidates are those who are baptized Catholic but have not yet received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. Candidates also include those who were baptized into another Christian faith tradition and now desire to join the Catholic Church. The celebration of this rite presumes that the

candidates are approaching the maturity of faith and understanding requisite for fuller life within the Catholic community.

The Sundays during Lent are especially significant for those completing their Sacraments of Initiation. Over the next several Sundays, our Elect (those who will be baptized, receive Eucharist and be confirmed) will celebrate the Lenten Scrutinies. It is the primary way that the Church assists her in their conversion process during Lent. These ritual celebrations on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent are communal prayers celebrated around the Elect to strengthen them in overcoming the power of sin in their lives, while helping them to grow in virtue. The parish community does not scrutinize the Elect; the Elect scrutinize their own lives and allow God to heal them.

Taking seriously the dynamic of scrutiny and conversion gives us a richer perspective of Lenten "giving up." What we are to give up more than anything else is sin, that which keeps us from living out our baptismal promises fully. Along with the Elect, we all need to approach the season of Lent by asking ourselves what needs to change in our lives if we are to live out the gospel values that Jesus taught us. Our journey through these forty days should be a movement ever closer to Christ and to the way of life he has exemplified for us. As we listen to stories about the woman at the well, the man born blind and the raising of Lazarus, we ask ourselves "for whom/what do I thirst? Do I recognize Jesus as the light of the world and ask him to remove my prejudice and complacency, allowing me to see the needs of others? Will I accept Jesus' offer of new life?"

As a parish family, let us prayerfully journey with those who will receive the Sacraments of Initiation. We pray for Brian Page, Isabella Ronchetti, Emmett Kanno, Logan Kanno, Vito Campanelli and Grace Fitzgerald.

Lord, we pray for those in the RCIA process who journey to you. Open their hearts to the fullness of your love. Deepen their understanding. Set their hearts on fire for the kingdom of God. We ask this through Jesus, who is the Way, the truth and the Life. Amen.







What is Synodality?

By convening this Synod, Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: synodality. 'Synod' is an ancient and venerable word in the Tradition of the Church, whose meaning indicates the path along which the People of God walk together. Equally, it refers to the Lord Jesus, who presents Himself as 'the way, the truth and the life' and to the fact that Christians, His followers, were originally called 'followers of the Way'.

First and foremost, synodality denotes the particular style that qualifies the life and mission of the Church, expressing her nature as the People of God journeying together and gathering in assembly, summoned by the Lord Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit to proclaim the Gospel. Ultimately, this path of walking together is the most effective way of manifesting and putting into practice the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God in the communion that Christ establishes between us. The entire People of God shares a common dignity and vocation through Baptism. All of us are called in virtue of our Baptism to be active participants in the life of the Church. Through this Synod, we are all invited to listen to one another so that, enlightened by the Word of God and united in prayer, we will be able to discern God's will and pursue the pathways to which God calls us - towards deeper communion, fuller participation, and greater openness to fulfilling our mission in the world.

What is the aim of this Synod?

The Church recognizes that synodality is an integral part of her very nature. Being a synodal Church finds expression in ecumenical councils, Synods of Bishops, diocesan Synods, and diocesan and parish councils. There are many ways by which we experience forms of "synodality" already across the Church. Yet being a synodal Church is not limited to these existing institutions. Indeed, synodality is a way of being by which the Church lives out her mission in the world. The mission of the Church requires the entire People of God to be on a journey together, with each member playing his or her crucial role, united with each other. A synodal Church walks forward in communion to pursue a common mission through the participation of each and every one of her members.

The objective of this Synodal Process is not to provide a temporary or one-time experience of synodality, but rather to provide an opportunity for the entire People of God to discern together how to move forward on the path towards being a more synodal Church in the long-term.

The Second Vatican Council reinvigorated the sense that all the baptised, both the hierarchy and the laity. are called to be active participants in the saving mission of the Church. The faithful have received the Holy Spirit in baptism and confirmation and are endowed with diverse gifts and charisms for the renewal and building up of the Church, as members of the Body of Christ. The path of synodality seeks to make pastoral decisions that reflect the will of God as closely as possible, grounding them in the living voice of the People of God.

How can I participate?

Some members of the Parish Commissions are already meeting to gather input from their groups. Beginning in March, you may participate by answering a questionnaire (insert from the bulletin or on-line) which asks you to provide input into two fundamental questions facing the Church:

- How does our "journeying together" allow the Church to proclaim the Gospel?
- 2) What steps is the Holy Spirit inviting us to take in order to grow as a Church? We will have four categories of specific questions that you may also find helpful to consider and reflect upon in formulating your response (four categories: Companions on the Journey; Listening; Celebration; and Sharing Responsibility for our Common Mission).


