

Lenten Regulations

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.





We ask this through Jesus, who is the Way, the Truth and the Life.




IMMACULATE CONCEPTION FOOD PANTRY

May God continue to bless you for your generosity in helping our brothers and sisters in Christ.




Are you an adult Catholic who has not yet been confirmed?



For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission

QUESTIONNAIRE

For this Synod, Pope Francis is calling on all Catholics to pray with him and then to reflect upon the topic of "synodality" together. Through our listening and our sharing, we will seek to understand what the Holy Spirit's will is for the Church. The aim of the Synod is to discern how we are "living the faith" and how we as a Church are achieving this together. The Synodal process includes, listening, discernment and participation. It is important to listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church, to discern His will for the current Church in the world, and then to **participate by answering the following fundamental questions: "How does our 'journeying together' allow the Church to proclaim the Gospel, and what steps is the Holy Spirit inviting us to take in order to grow as a Church?"**

It is hoped that this will foster greater participation in the life of the Church, will build communion with one another through journeying and walking the path of faith together, and will create a solid foundation where committing to mission and fulfilling mission is encouraged and possible for all of us. The synodal process will conclude in 2023.

- 1) How does our "journeying together" allow the Church to proclaim the Gospel? -----

- 2) What steps is the Holy Spirit inviting us to take in order to grow as a Church?-----

- 3) COMPANIONS ON THE JOURNEY – in Church and society, we walk side by side on the same road:

Who are those who seem further apart?

What can we do to better share the love of God in the midst of the whole human family?

How is this "journeying together" happening today at IC?

Where are we headed? What can we do to better support our journeying together?

- 4) LISTENING – the first step, requires an open mind and heart, without prejudice:

How well do we listen to people? What are our limitations in our ability to listen?

How can we improve our listening to all, especially to those who have different views than our own, those who feel marginalized, or on the peripheries?

- 5) CELEBRATION – "walking together" is only possible if it is based on communal listening to the WORD and the celebration of the Eucharist:

How do prayer and liturgical celebrations actually inspire and guide our common life and mission in our community?

How do we promote the active participation of all the faithful in the liturgy?

- 6) SHARING RESPONSIBILITY FOR OUR COMMON MISSION – all members are called to participate:

What hinders the baptized from being active in mission?

How does the community support its members who serve society in various ways?

How is the Holy Spirit calling us to mission and service today?


