

Dear Friends In Christ,

When I was a child it was customary for me to give up chocolate during the Lenten season. I must admit, I found it very hard to do so. As time has passed, I've come to a greater realization that the season of Lent can have far more implications for spiritual growth if we are willing to look at ourselves. For Lent this year I am trying to grow closer to Christ as I reflect upon the seven Capital Sins and their existence in my life. I hope to deepen my relationship with Christ through recognizing how I have failed to be like Him because of the presence of these sins. Perhaps you might also consider looking at the Capital Sins in order to develop a better understanding of what is in your heart and soul. During the weeks of Lent I'll share with you some reflections about each of them.

Pride

Mother Teresa spoke about some ways to reduce the presence of this sin in our lives. Without a doubt she is a modern day example of a person who had no pride. Mother encouraged us to speak as little as possible about ourselves. She also taught us that we should not speak to be admired or loved and that we should not dwell on faults of others. Mother encouraged her sisters to give in, in discussions, even if you are right. Her suggestions certainly are contrary to the times when make sure that we are right and others are wrong. Sometimes it is better to simply listen and not to speak.

As we remove pride from our lives, we can replace it with humility. I certainly have greater respect for the deep humility that I often see in people as opposed to prideful words or actions. The most humble man to ever walk the earth was Jesus Christ. He taught His disciples to learn from His example. Let us pray during the journey of this Lenten season that we will become more like Jesus, who has humbled Himself for our welfare. The people around Jesus expected Him to start a great kingdom here on this earth. It was very hard for them to realize that the kingdom He was preparing for all of us would be in heaven.

Lenten Regulations

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. All from the age of 18 years up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 3. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
- 5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Church year. All of the faithful are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial (in addition to following the Lenten regulations), serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.

Those who are sick, pregnant, or nursing, or whose health would adversely be affected by fasting or abstinence, should not consider themselves bound by these norms.

The father returned to his project thinking he had just bought himself some much needed time to finish his project; he knew his son had no idea what the map of the world looked like.

The boy immediately began to gather the pieces. Excited at the prospect of going to the movies, he put the pieces of the puzzle together within minutes. To his father's surprise, the young boy rushed back to his father bringing him the completed map of the world. His surprised father said in amazement, "How did you finish it so quickly!?!" The boy smiled and said, "You know, Dad, I didn't know what the world looked like, but I had an idea what the kid looked like that was on the other side of the picture. So, I put the picture of the kid together and turned it over knowing if I got the kid right, the world would be right!" "If you can get the kid right, the world will be right! I have been known to say, 'we're not going to change the nearly impossible situations that challenge Red Lake, but our hope is to change one student at a time and they will make the necessary changes!' 


We welcome Fr. Jerry Rogers from St. Mary's Mission in Red Lake, MN back "home" to IC!



The Sundays during Lent are especially significant for those completing their Sacraments of Initiation. Over the next several Sundays, our Elect (she who will be baptized, receive Eucharist and be confirmed) will celebrate the Lenten Scrutinies. It is the primary way that the Church assists her in her conversion process during Lent. These ritual celebrations on the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent are communal prayers celebrated around the Elect to strengthen them in overcoming the power of sin in their lives, while helping them to grow in virtue. The parish community does not scrutinize the Elect; the Elect scrutinize their own lives and allow God to heal them.

Taking seriously the dynamic of scrutiny and conversion gives us a richer perspective of Lenten "giving up." What we are to give up more than anything else is sin, that which keeps us from living out our baptismal promises fully. Along with the Elect, we all need to approach the season of Lent by asking ourselves what needs to change in our lives if we are to live out the gospel values that Jesus taught us. Our journey through these forty days should be a movement ever closer to Christ and to the way of life he has exemplified for us. As we listen to stories about the woman at the well, the man born blind and the raising of Lazarus, we ask ourselves "for whom/what do I thirst? Do I recognize Jesus as the light of the world and ask him to remove my prejudice and complacency, allowing me to see the needs of others? Will I accept Jesus' offer of new life?"

As a parish family, let us prayerfully journey with those who will receive the Sacraments of Initiation. We pray for Jada Cannon, Shauna Brueggen, Christine Harezlak, Emil Amarei, Mia Carreon and Nicholas Crededio.

Lord, we pray for those in the RCIA process who journey to you.

Open their hearts to the fullness of your love. Deepen their understanding.

Set their hearts on fire for the kingdom of God. We ask this through Jesus, who is the Way, Amen.



We Are IC Capital Campaign


