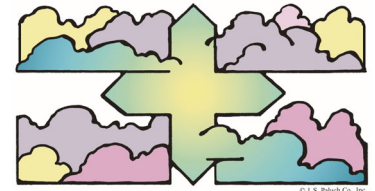

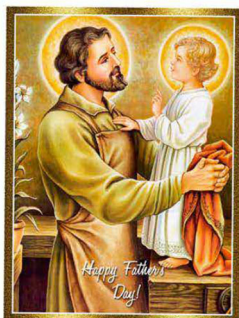
- Masks are recommended, not required.
- All pews are used. A section on the side aisle of pews nearest the music on the east side of the church will be reserved for those people who wish to social distance and wear masks.
- If it is your preference to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, we ask that you sit on the left (east) side of the church in either of the sections where the priest typically distributes Communion. It is also requested that you come up at the end of the Communion line so the priest has the opportunity to sanitize his hands as he distributes the Eucharist.
- Holy water is once again in the fonts.
- The Sign of Peace should be shared without physical contact.
- There will not be distribution of the Precious Blood.

Approximately two years ago, Catholics in our diocese as well as the rest of our state and country were given permission to not follow the obligation for Sunday Mass. Thankfully, because we now live in a much healthier environment and are able to worship together, effective Palm Sunday, the dispensation no longer exists. What this means is that, in our roles of being active members of the Catholic Church, attending Mass weekly is an obligation we need to follow. As always, if you are ill or contagious to other, according Canon Law, you may decide for yourself whether to attend Mass or not.

Dear Friends,

With the onset of the coronavirus pandemic more than two years ago, our goal in the Diocese of Joliet has been to ensure the safety and well-being of all clergy, religious, lay ministers, parishioners, employees and volunteers while providing access to worship and the Eucharist. We have adjusted our safety protocols as COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations increased and then decreased. I want to personally thank you for your diligence in safeguarding the health of our brothers and sisters in Christ.

When the state of Illinois lifted its mask mandate for indoor public places on February 28, we followed suit for all church and office activities. We also removed practically all other precautions, but left in place the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

The time has come to remove that final provision, and we will do so on Palm Sunday. What better time for us all to come together again than Palm Sunday, which marks the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem and the beginning of Holy Week.

Of course, if individuals are ill or contagious to others, Canon law allows them to decide for themselves if they should attend Mass.

I am excited the Diocese of Joliet will fully reunite as one body in Christ for the liturgies leading up to Easter and beyond.

I am reminded of the words Pope Francis wrote in *Fratelli Tutti* during the initial months of the pandemic: "Let us dream, then, as a single human family, as fellow travelers sharing the same flesh, as children of the same earth which is our common home, each of us bringing the richness of his or her beliefs and convictions, each of us with his or her own voice, brothers and sisters all." (Paragraph 8)

Let us welcome home our family with joy and continue to pray for each other.

St. Francis Xavier Cabrini and St. Gianna Baretta Molla

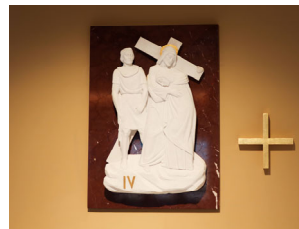
There are still three open panels for saints and their symbols.

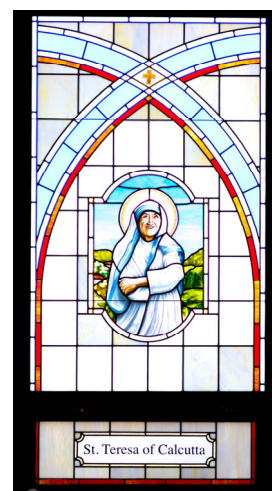

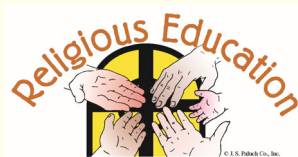

On the weekend of April 23-24, our diocese will take up a second collection for the Catholic Home Missions Appeal.

Home mission dioceses are those dioceses in the United States and its territories that need outside help to provide basic pastoral services, such as the Mass, the sacraments, religious education, and ministry training for priests, deacons, religious sisters and laypeople. These dioceses often face fragile financial situations, vast distances or difficult terrain. Nearly 40% of the dioceses in the United States and its territories are considered home missions.

We are one Catholic Church. What happens to one of us, affects us all. As Pope Francis notes in *Fratelli Tutti*, "we need to develop the awareness that nowadays we are either all saved together or no one is saved." (Paragraph 137).

Let us remember our brothers and sisters in Christ in home mission dioceses so they may share fully in our Catholic faith.

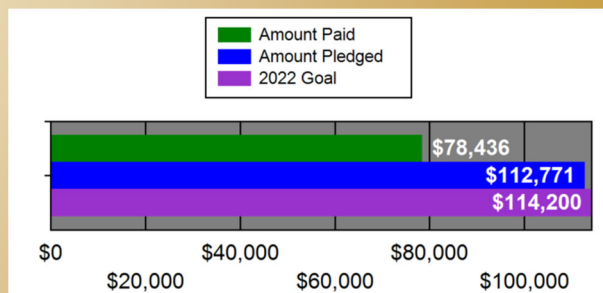
