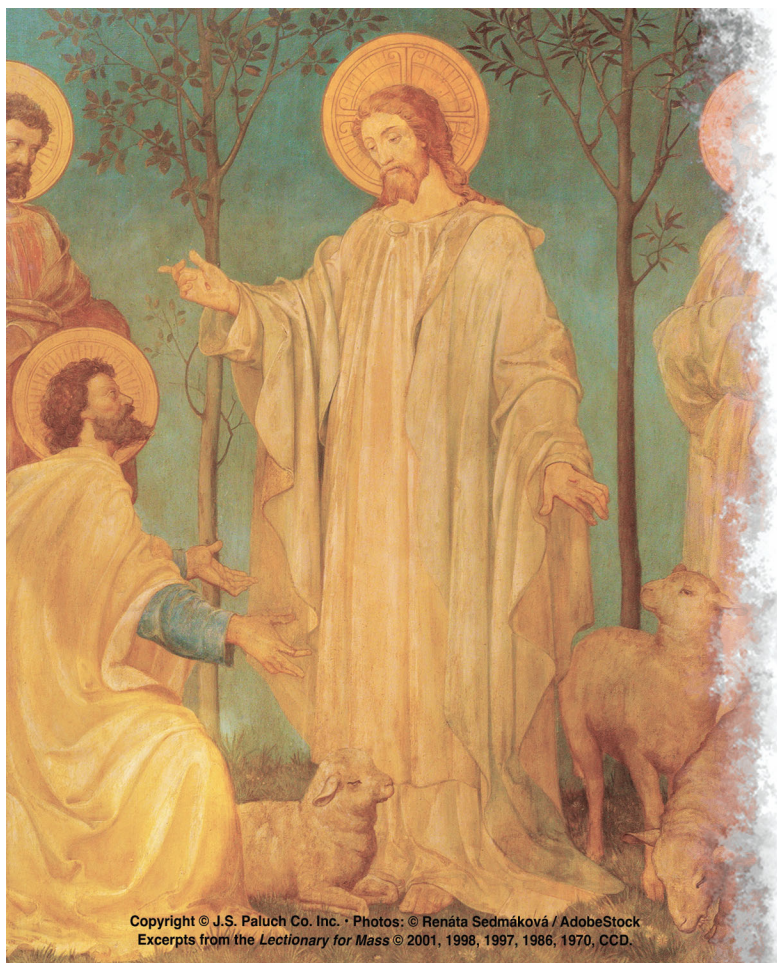

Daily Masses

On Fridays when there is a Grade School Mass at 8:00 am, masses will be celebrated at 6:15 and 8:00am. On these days there will be no 7:30 am mass. When there is not a grade school mass, masses will be celebrated at 6:15 and 7:30 am. Those who regularly attend the 7:30 am mass are encouraged and welcome to participate either in the 6:15 or 8:00 am masses when there is not a 7:30 am mass.



- Masks are recommended, not required.
- All pews are used. A section on the side aisle of pews nearest the music on the east side of the church will be reserved for those people who wish to social distance and wear masks.
- If it is your preference to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, we ask that you sit on the left (east) side of the church in either of the sections where the priest typically distributes Communion. It is also requested that you come up at the end of the Communion line so the priest has the opportunity to sanitize his hands as he distributes the Eucharist.
- Holy water is once again in the fonts.
- The Sign of Peace should be shared without physical contact.
- There will not be distribution of the Precious Blood.

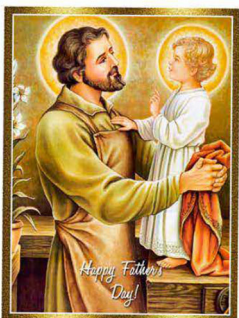

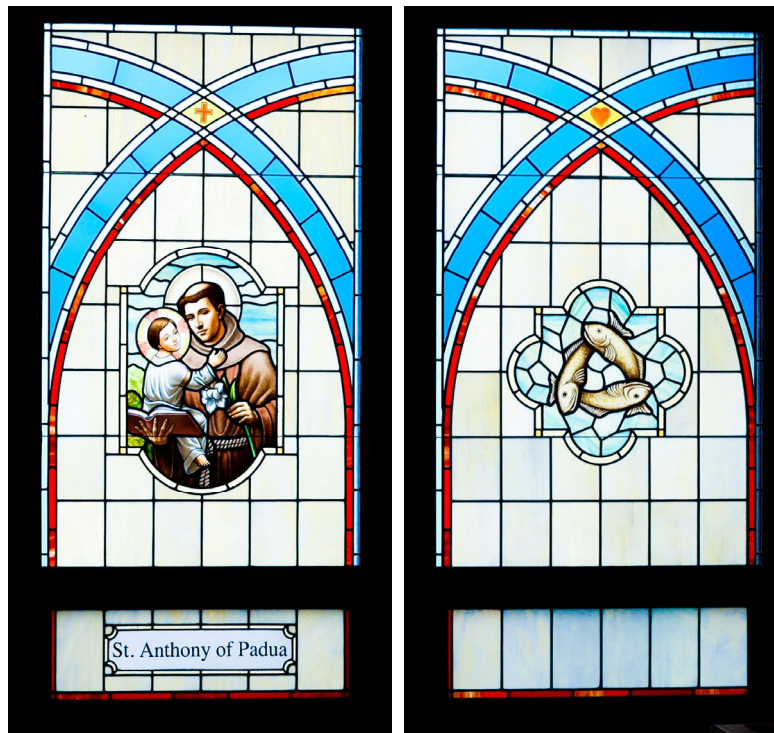

Sacred Heart Chapel Windows



St. Anthony of Padua

born **Fernando Martins de Bulhões**; August 15, 1195 – June 13, 1231

A Portuguese Catholic priest and friar of the Franciscan Order, St. Anthony was born and raised by a wealthy family in Lisbon, Portugal, and died in Padua, Italy. Noted by his

contemporaries for his powerful preaching, expert knowledge of scripture, and undying love and devotion to the poor and the sick, he was one of the most quickly canonized saints in church history. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII on January 16, 1946. He is also known as the patron saint of lost souls and items.

The window of St. Anthony along with his symbol window are closest to the altar along York Road. The fish were chosen as his symbol because of the miracle below.

Once Anthony had travelled to the city of Rimini because it was a hotbed of heresy. The city leaders had ordered everyone to ignore him, so no one turned up for his homilies. Wherever Anthony went, he was greeted by silence.

Anthony walked along praying and reflecting upon what had happened. As he walked outside of the town, he came to the mouth of the Marecchia River where it flows into the Adriatic. There he began to address the crowds, not of people but of fish.

He called out, "You, fish of the river and sea, listen to the Word of God because the heretics do not wish to hear it." Suddenly there were thousands of fish neatly arranged in rows, all pushing their heads through the surface of the water as if they were straining to listen to every one of Anthony's words.

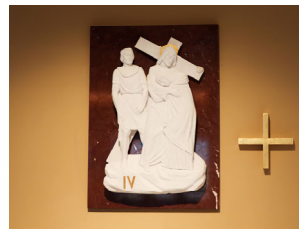
There are still three open panels for saints and their symbols.
