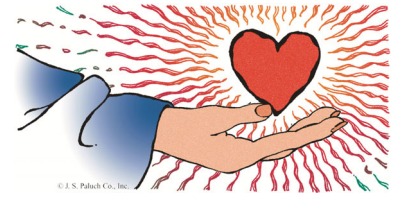

 A mass intention is a wonderful way to show someone that you care!



- Masks are recommended, not required.
- All pews are used. A section on the side aisle of pews nearest the music on the east side of the church will be reserved for those people who wish to social distance and wear masks.
- If it is your preference to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, we ask that you sit on the left (east) side of the church in either of the sections where the priest typically distributes Communion. It is also requested that you come up at the end of the Communion line so the priest has the opportunity to sanitize his hands as he distributes the Eucharist.
- Holy water is once again in the fonts.
- The Sign of Peace should be shared without physical contact.
- There will not be distribution of the Precious Blood.

Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother," and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam! Amen.

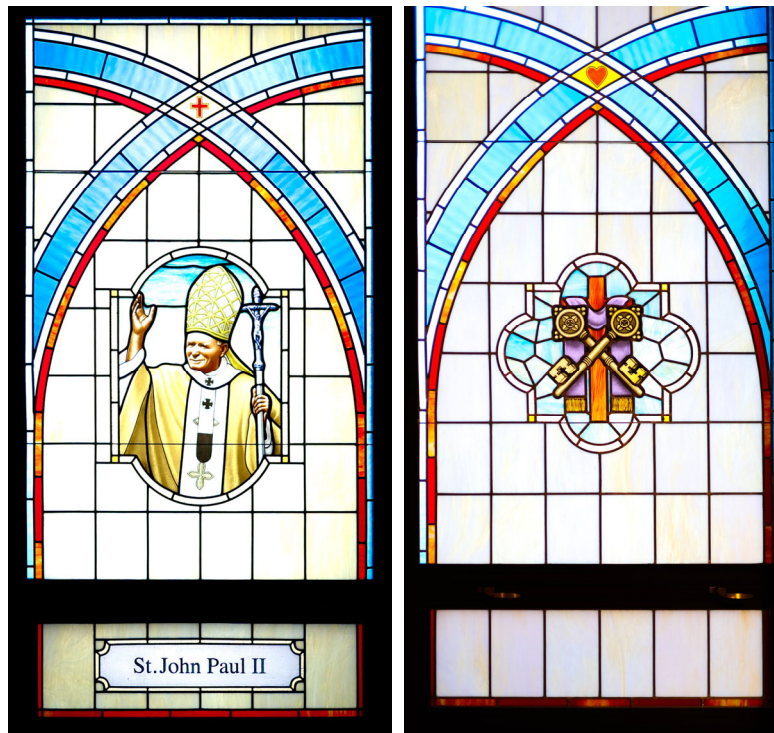
Alpha, The Marriage Course offers 7 weeks of date night experiences to address a variety of topics. You will be given a wide range of things to deepen and enrich your marriage.

St. John Paul II

Born in Wadowice, Poland, Karol Jozef Wojtyla had lost his mother, father, and older brother before his 21st birthday. While working in a quarry and a chemical factory, he enrolled in an “underground” seminary in Kraków. Ordained in 1946, he was immediately sent to Rome where he earned a doctorate in theology. Communist officials allowed Wojtyla to be appointed auxiliary bishop of Kraków in 1958, considering him a relatively harmless intellectual. They could not have been more wrong! Bishop Wojtyla attended all four sessions of Vatican II and contributed especially to its *Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World*.

Elected pope in October 1978, he took the name of his short-lived, immediate predecessor. Pope John Paul II was the first non-Italian pope in 455 years. In time, he made pastoral visits to 124 countries, including several with small Christian populations. In 1989, John Paul II began World Youth Day and traveled to several countries for those celebrations. In his 27 years of papal ministry, John Paul II wrote 14 encyclicals and five books, canonized 482 saints and beatified 1,338 people. Pope Benedict XVI beatified John Paul II in 2011, and Pope Francis canonized him in 2014.

The symbol chosen for St. John Paul II was the keys with the cross. Keys were part of his papal seal. The one of the right alludes to the power of the Kingdom of Heaven. The one on the left to the authority of the papacy on earth.

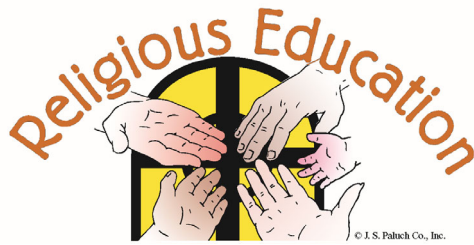

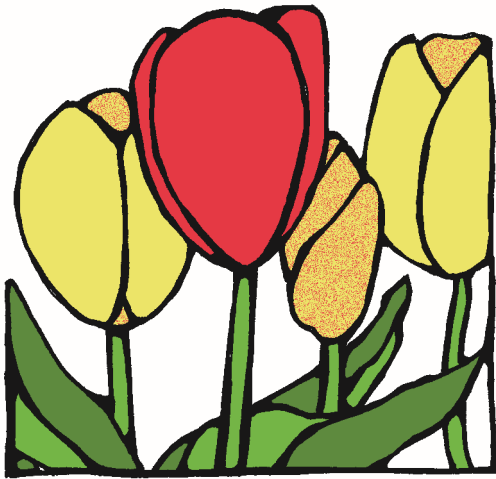
