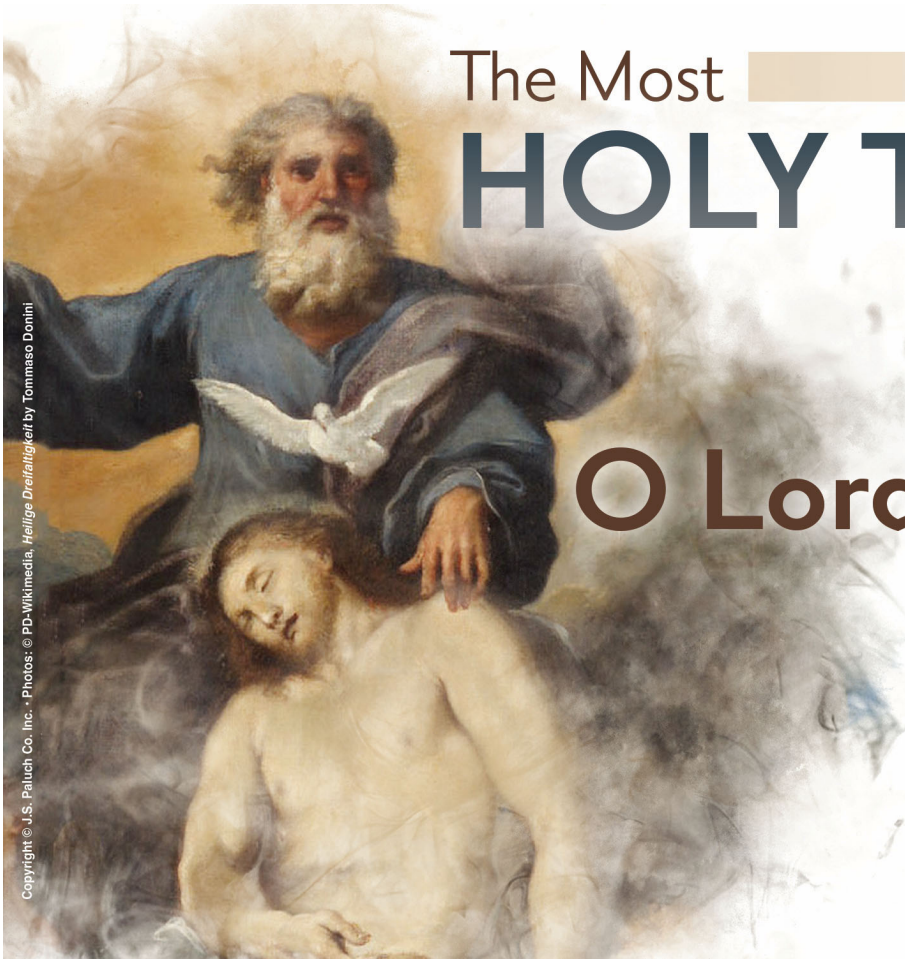

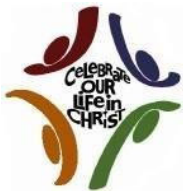

A mass intention is a wonderful way to show someone that you care!

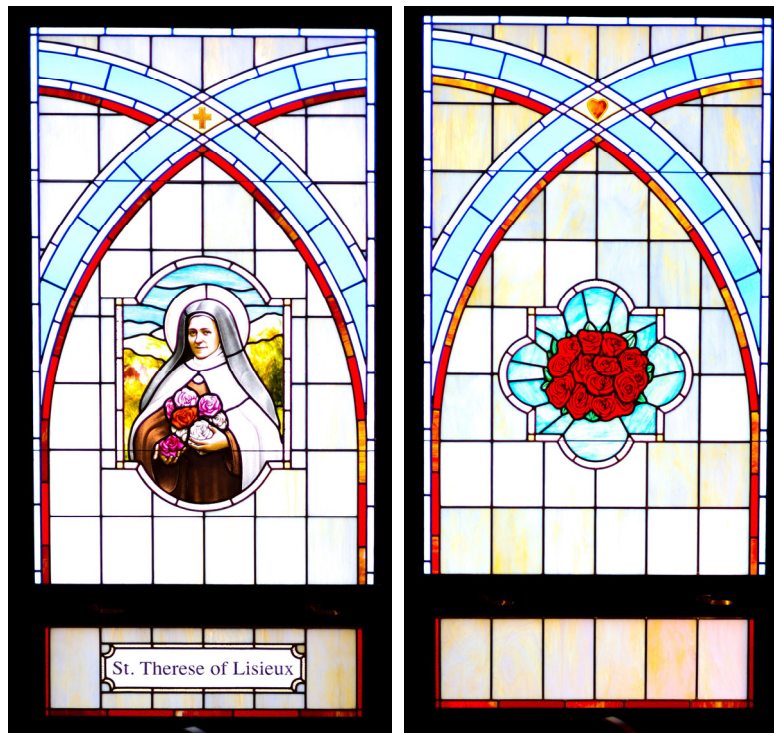
### **53rd Sunday**

## Sacred Heart Chapel Windows



**St. Thérèse of Lisieux**, also called **the Little Flower**, was born **Marie-Françoise-Thérèse Martin**, on January 2, 1873 in Alençon, France and died on September 30, 1897. She was canonized May 17, 1925. Her feast day is October 1. She was a Carmelite nun whose service to her Roman Catholic order, although outwardly unremarkable, was later recognized for its exemplary spiritual accomplishments. She was named a doctor of the church by Pope John Paul II in 1997. She is a patron saint of missions and of florists.

Thérèse was the youngest of nine children, five of whom survived childhood. After her mother died of breast cancer in 1877, Thérèse moved with her family to Lisieux. In the deeply religious atmosphere of her home, her piety developed early and intensively. All four of her elder sisters became nuns, and at the age of 15 she entered the Carmelite convent at Lisieux, having been refused admission a year earlier. Her burial site at Lisieux became a place of pilgrimage, and a basilicabearing her name was built there.

St. Thérèse defined her doctrine of the Little Way as “the way of spiritual childhood, the way of trust and absolute surrender.” She was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1925 and was the youngest person to be designated a doctor of the church.

The symbol chosen for St. Therese of Lisieux is a bouquet of roses as she was the Little Flower representing her little way of life.

# Synod 2021/2023

## For a synodal Church

communion | participation | mission

Through the Synod on Synodality, the Catholic Church is currently engaging in a global listening process open to everyone and aimed at renewing our ability to live out our mission and build up our communion in our own particular times and places. The Diocese of Joliet and 175 other dioceses throughout the country, have just completed a more than eight-month-long process of listening, which will help to inform the next phases of the multi-year process set out by the Vatican. This synod is an invitation to listen to the lived experiences of the whole of the people of God and discern, together, where the Holy Spirit is calling us as a Church.

Immaculate Conception Parish submitted the results of our listening sessions and online survey to the Diocese of Joliet in May 2022. The major themes that we heard from IC are:

1. Welcome, embrace and include people in word and action in the Church
2. Teach the truth of the Gospel
3. Be glad and rejoice
4. Live as Christians in a political and secular world
5. Consider and overcome barriers to unity in the Church
6. Be accountable and active members of the Church

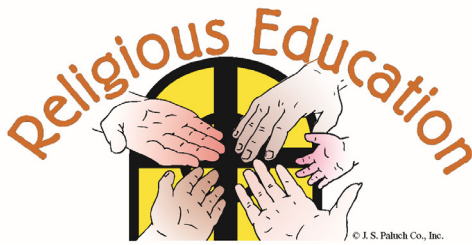

## WORLD REFUGEE DAY



**World Refugee Sunday** is celebrated on June 20. Unfortunately, the Northern Illinois Food Bank is experiencing food supply issues, just as we all are. Our selections have dwindled considerably and our shelves are fairly empty of staples. 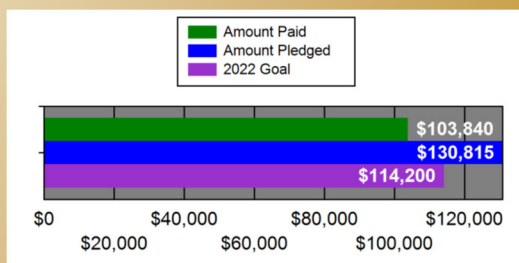
