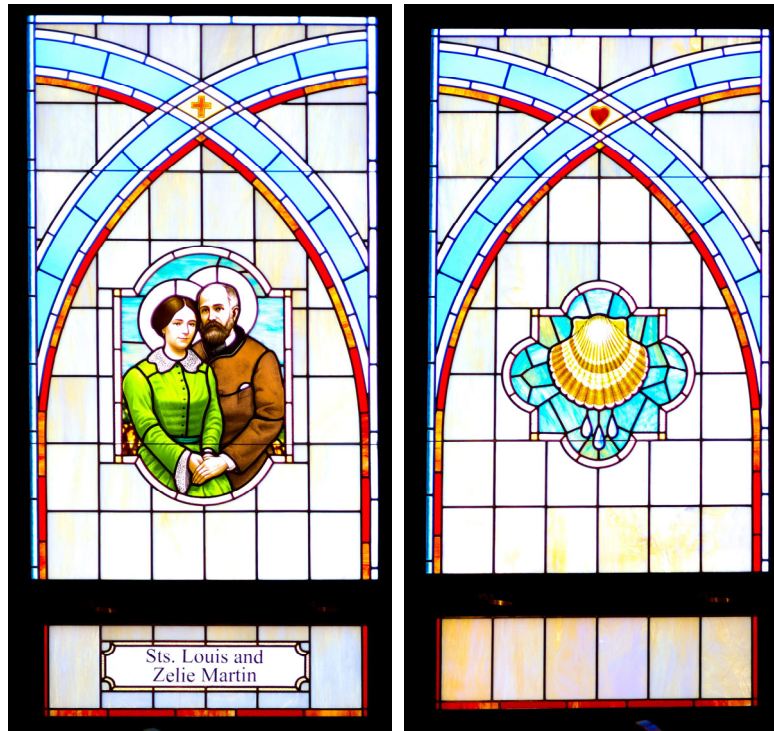

St. Louis: August 22, 1823 – July 29, 1894

St. Zelig: December 23, 1831 – August 28, 1877

Feast Day: July 12

Patronage: Illness, Marriage, Parenting, Widowers

This couple is best known as the parents of St. Therese of Lisieux (the Little Flower), but they are models of holiness in their own right. They are only the second married couple to be canonized. The family lived a comfortable lifestyle. They suffered the loss of four children at an early age, but their devotion never wavered.

In 1877, at age 45, Zelig Martin died of breast cancer. Louis and his daughters moved to Lisieux. Gradually his daughters left to enter the convent. Despite his loneliness he said: "It is a great, great honor for me that the Good Lord desires to take all of my children. If I had anything better, I would not hesitate to offer it to him."

Louis and Zelig Martin were beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in 2008 and canonized by Pope Francis in 2015.

The symbol chose for Sts. Louis and Zelig Martin is a shell, as shells are often used to represent the importance of marriage; two halves creating one piece.

Welcome, embrace and include people in word and action in the Church.

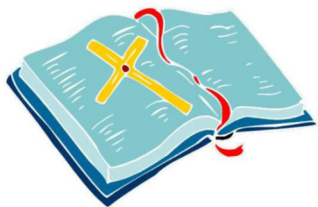
- Continue to listen, reach out and find common ground between all ages within the church, emphasizing relationships versus rules and regulations.

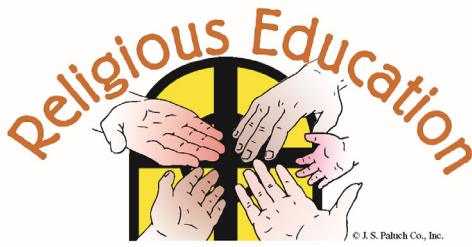

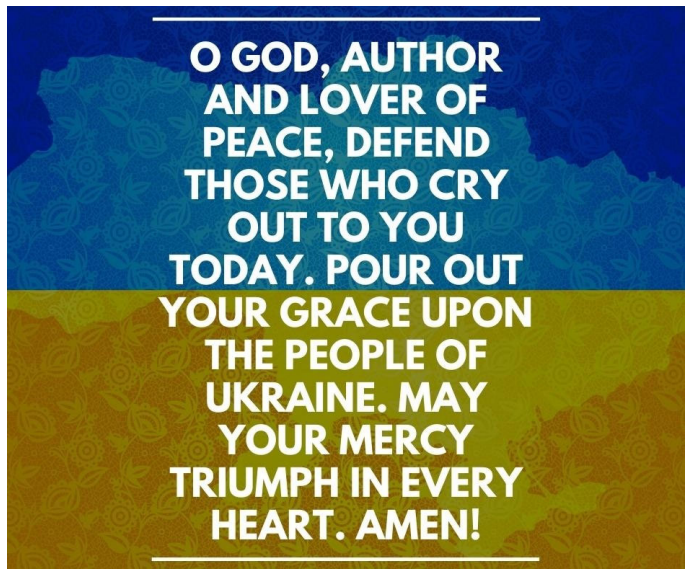
