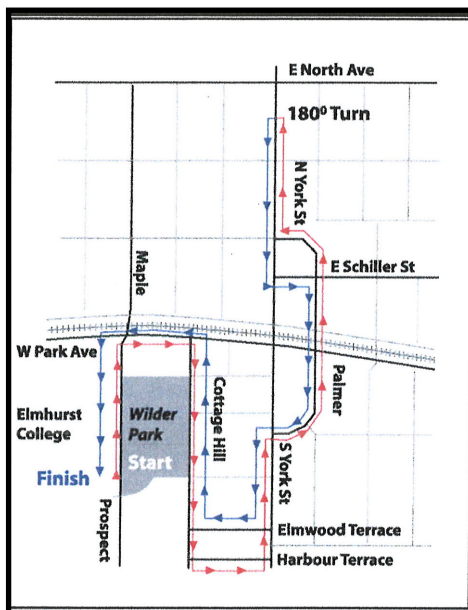


Sacred Heart Chapel Windows



St. Padre Pio, also known as **Saint Pius of Pietrelcina** was born in Italy on May 25, 1887. He was an Italian Franciscan Capuchin, friar, priest, stigmatist, and mystic, now venerated as a saint in the Catholic Church. Born **Francesco Forgione**, he was given the name of Pius (Italian: *Pio*) when he joined the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin. Padre Pio became famous for exhibiting stigmata for most of his life, thereby generating much interest and controversy. He died on September 23, 1968. He was both beatified (1999) and canonized (2002) by Pope John Paul II. The Sanctuary of Saint Pio of Pietrelcina is located in San Giovanni Rotondo, Province of Foggia, Italy.

St. Padre Pio's chosen symbol is two hands representing his stigmata.

Immaculate Conception Parish submitted our feedback to the Diocese of Joliet in May 2022. Last week's bulletin shared some of the comments. Here is a summary of the remaining comments.

Live as Christians in a political and secular world

Live a Christian life through our actions, not just words - the Beatitudes.

Highlight the good work that the Church does at all levels (local, world).

Focus on knowing, teaching and spreading the Gospel, not divisive politics.

Address the divide between those concerned about being a relevant "voice" in today's world, versus a "return to the past" (e.g., issues with "Latin Mass").

Explain the Church's teaching on moral theology to help address serious societal challenges and misunderstandings (e.g., same sex attraction) and encourage ministries that support truth.

Consider and overcome barriers to unity in the Church

Eliminate obstacles and barriers where possible (e.g., married priests, nuns; women deacons/priests; divorced and LGBTQ+ 's sacramental status.)

Change, but do not compromise doctrinal and moral truths for those "demanded" by some in society and the Church.

Acknowledge the polarizing and political divisions of USCCB, but emphasize and nourish what we share in common and celebrate it as a Church.

Support aging and lack of priests and vocations to priesthood and religious life.

Be accountable and active members of the Church

Bishops should reach out to show assurance of safety of youth and demonstrations of correcting the past wrongs.

The laity should increase our participation, role and voice to better serve the Church and to sanctify the world.

Mass participation is hindered by busy/overcommitted schedule, laziness, misplaced priorities, fear of judgment, and a sense of being overwhelmed by practices and beliefs that do not seem relevant.

Next week's bulletin will describe the next steps for the Synod on Synodality.

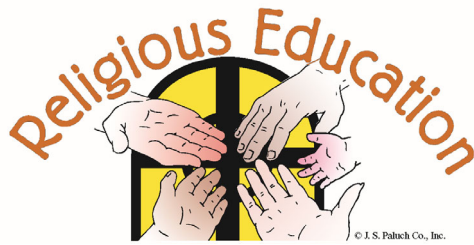

From the Office of the Bishop

June 2022

Dear Friends,

We will soon take up a collection for Peter's Pence, which provides essential support for the Holy See's activities and helps Pope Francis assist the victims of wars, oppression and natural disasters around the world.

The Holy Father's ministry of mercy this spring has aided victims of a situation with which we are all too familiar: the war in Ukraine. Pope Francis in March donated a fully equipped ambulance to the city of Lviv, the Ukrainian city closest to the Polish border where many refugees have sought shelter. Earlier that month, the pope donated medical supplies -- such as syringes, bandages, disinfectants and other products -- to Ukrainian refugees.

Please prayerfully consider supporting this year's Peter's Pence collection during the weekend of June 25-26 as an act of mercy and charity.
